-  Caribbean Seasonal evergreen forest with coconut palm
-  Caribbean Seasonal evergreen and semi-deciduous forest on karst
-  Caribbean Seasonal evergreen and evergreen forest
-  Caribbean Salt or mud flats
-  Caribbean Pterocarpus swamp
-  Caribbean Pasture, hay or other grassy areas
